Dates for Curriculum Nights will be sent to you once they are confirmed with each team. I look forward to meeting all of you.

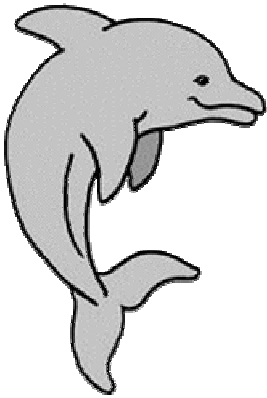
