The year we have spent exploring Writers' Workshop has been both exciting and challenging. We have experimented with units of study, focus lessons, conferring, and small-group instruction. 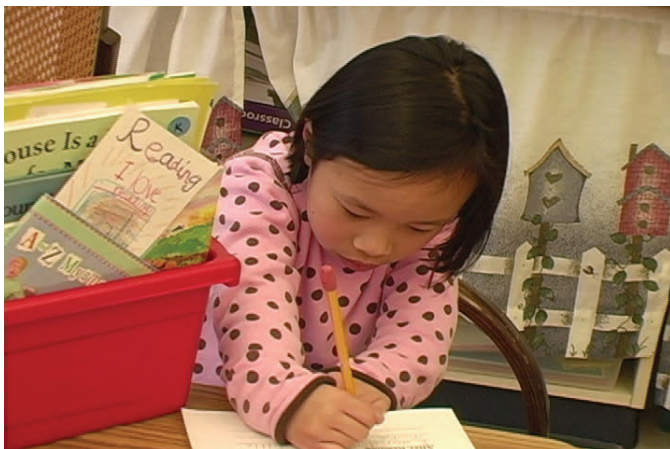
