Wachusett Regional High School Mission Statement

Wachusett Regional High School is committed to an educational process that fosters independence and responsibility in our students. By offering diverse, challenging, academic program and rich co-curricular activities, WRHS strives to provide students with the skills and knowledge to achieve their potential as life-long learners.

Wachusett Partnership Program

The Wachusett Partnership Program is designed to give students a significant experience in an area of study that interests them. The purpose is to provide students with enough of a background in their area of study to make them competitive with their peers when either applying for jobs after high school or continuing on with post high school studies.

Within the program, there are many courses of study offered, and during sophomore year, students will have an opportunity to apply for a major if they are interested. If accepted, they will have to complete 15 credits within their major prior to graduation. In each major there are required courses, but in many majors, students will also have the opportunity to elect classes from other disciplines that will enhance their major.

Although students may not apply for a major until their sophomore year, they may begin to take some electives upon entering WRHS that will count towards their major (depending on the course of study). **We encourage students interested in a major to begin taking the classes in their first two years as available.** Choosing a major is not a requirement for graduation but rather an opportunity to investigate an area of interest that students may choose to take advantage of.
